



My camera has a built-in meter. I don't need a hand held meter Or.... do I?

You certainly do! Built-in meters are terrific but they have their limitations. If you take pictures only in good light, on conventional film, without filters (or only with ordinary filters), if you don't take imaginative pictures, if you never take extreme close-ups or copy pictures from books, in short, if you stay within the snapshot region....you don't need a handheld meter.

But if you ever want to take a picture which is beyond the scope of your built-in meter, you certainly do need a handheld meter. Not just any handheld meter, of course. Lenses are **Delicate Creatures...**

Would you believe that some people buy expensive lenses and let them get dusty, bruised, even scratched - almost before they use them for the first time? Let's hope that you are not one of these people! Lenses are much more delicate than they look. When you hold a lens in your hand it is very difficult to believe that dust can ruin it very quickly. The delicate focusing mechanism can freeze up because the lubricant inside the focusing helix combines with dust and dust is grit! I don't have to tell you what happens.

And I certainly don't have to tell you what happens when the front element of your lens gets scratched. But you probably did not

know that some of the outer control rings on the lens are very thin, even though they may look quite substantial. Leave a lens unprotected inside your gadget bag and the pressure of one item against the other will get a control ring "out of round" and suddenly you can't focus the lens any more. And you can't figure out what happened.

Never, NEVER!, put a lens (or any other delicate accessory for that matter) "naked" in your gadget bag. For a ridiculously small investment you can buy "insurance" against damage, against dust and against scratches: the secret is SOFT POUCHES. It must be a secret because so few people seem to know it. If you look into the gadget bag of the average amateur photographer (professionals usually know better!) you will find all kinds of accessories rubbing against each other, and, in the process, ruining themselves. And it's so easy to prevent! Just follow this advice: No matter what it is, protect it with a pouch before you put it in your gadget bag! This means ANY ITEM, not only lenses. Exposure Meters, Flashguns, Extension Tubes, Tele Converters, ANYTHING you carry with you. Pouches are cheap. Accessories (especially lenses) are expensive and so are repairs.

Some pouches do not protect your equipment adequately. They are made of thin plastic material and do not have a soft lining. They may cost a few cents less but they are no bargain. We have a stake in protecting equipment and we wouldn't sell you a pouch which we, ourselves, would not use. We offer you pouches made of a heavy gauge manmade material which feels like supple glove leather. Every pouch has a color-contrasting velvet-like soft lining which does not "shed" or rub off on your equipment.



Remember the time when you wished you and your camera were invisible? Remember those "human-interest" pictures you could not shoot because you were too timid to point your camera? And how about those candid shots of children which you did not take because the little angels (?) would stop what they were doing when they saw the snooping camera. How Good is 3M's New Ultra Speed Film?

By now you know that I never write about a camera, a lens, an accessory, or even a film, if I haven't used it myself.

When the Sales Representative of 3M told me of the new 3M Ultra Fast ASA/ISO ONE THOUSAND Color Slide Film I told him that I do not want to carry it. "You are passing up a terrific film" he said and walked out, leaving behind a few 36-Exposure rolls.

It's not every day that I get free film. Against my better (?) judgment I used the film. Not for an important assignment, mind you, just to take some pictures of my neighbor's baby who has just started to crawl around. Normal room light, 100mm lens, F6.3. Regular E-6 Processing.

Wow! Did I change my tune! I had never seen anything like it. Beautifully exposed, sharp, color true, and, because of the small F/Stop, an amazing depth of field. How about grain?

You'd expect an ASA-1000 film to be very grainy and it is indeed grainier than my regular slide film, the ASA-25 Kodachrome but while the ASA-1000 film is 40 times as fast as the ASA-25 film it certainly isn't 40 times as grainy! It is just a little grainier and I wouldn't worry about it. It is certainly a heck of a lot less grainy than I had expected it to be.

In the meantime I took some more test shots under controlled conditions. The resolution (sharpness) turned out to be better than 65 lines per mm, better than the resolving power of most lenses! The optimum color balance is for 5500K light but the tolerance is amazing. How about the contrast? Did you expect it to be harsh and overly contrasty? Well, let me assure you that it is not harsh at all. You will love the even flow of colors like the ones mixed on the palette of an artist.

By now you will have guessed that I like this new film very much. I don't expect you to take my word for it that it is an excellent film but I advise you to try it yourself. At our low prices you may buy as few as three rolls or you may buy it in multiples of ten. Your net prices are as follows:



If It's Worth Recording, It's Worth Recording On Good Tape!

The market is overflowing with "bargain" tapes. They come in from Hong Kong, Taiwan, Korea, and far-away places whose names nobody can pronounce or spell. I am no better than most people: I have used "bargain" tapes. Now I have to be honest: I have regretted it bitterly. Several of my irreplaceable recordings have been ruined. Well, I have learned my lesson. I'd rather cut down on the quantity of recordings but I'll never again try to save on the quality of my recording tape.

Well, I find it difficult to cut down on the quantity because I do it, let's say: semi-professionally. In my search for the right balance of cost vs. quality I have used many brands and types of tapes. Usually, the tapes that were very good for my purpose were very bad for my purse. The search went on.

Germany. Although I had what I thought was an ample supply of recording tape I ran out of tape (as usual). The German recording engineer arranged for a supply of tape which turned out to be a German product. I am not going to bore you with the story of the German field trip. I'll skip to the end of the story: I fell in love with the tape. Before you say: "No accounting for tastes", try the tape yourself and see what happens to YOU!

Let's be serious. I found a tape which is excellent and, because of the rather favorable exchange rate, very reasonable. At last I found the ideal balance of cost vs. quality in a tape which I find very good for my purpose AND very good for my purpose! Will YOU come to the same conclusion? I think you will, but who am I to predict your likes and dislikes? I can only suggest that you send us an order and make your own tests.

There are two types of tape and they are both available in one-hour and 1½-hour cassettes (C-60 and C-90). Type 1 is an excellent Ferric Oxide Tape and Type 2 is an even better Chrome Dioxide (CrO2) Tape. For top quality amateur recordings I recommend Ferric Oxide Tape ("Normal" Setting of your recorder). For semi-professional and professional recordings I recommend the Chrome Dioxide Tape ("CrO2" Setting of your recorder). If your recorder cannot be set for different tapes, buy the "Type 1" (Ferric Oxide) tape because it will work best in your machine.

I have often wondered who writes the ads for the "leading brands" of tapes. Some highpowered, highpriced copy writer in some highpowered, highpriced ad agency, no doubt. The ads are full of pseudotechnical jargon intended to impress the reader who does not really know what it all means. I believe that you, the prospective user, want to know what the results will be. You want to know a few basic facts such as the sound output, the noise level, the linear response, and a few basic facts about the mechanical construction of the shell. You want to know what SOUND you can get out of the tape. You don't want to get your hair blown. You don't want to get your wine glasses broken. You don't want to read baloney ads. You want facts.

You will find these facts in the separate box. If you are technically-minded, the facts will tell you quite a bit about the tape you are going to get. I wish I could demonstrate the SOUND of the tape in this little article. Obviously, that cannot be done. Again I suggest that you send us an order and LISTEN to the tape. Compare the recording to the original (if possible). If you have a halfway decent machine, you will not find any difference in sound between the source and the recording.

The most amazing part of this little report is the price of the tape. You may wonder how we can price quality tape so low. Well, it's not really so amazing. There are two reasons: I mentioned already that it comes from Germany and that the exchange rate is quite favorable which means that we get more Deutschmarks for our dollars. And — we import the tape directly from Germany. There are no middlemen, no importers, no distributors, no jobbers. In fact, there is nobody to add his little (or big) profit before the tape reaches us. Which translates into low prices TO YOU!!!

Could you use a GOOD Magnifying Glass?

Do I have to tell you that most magnifying "glasses" are magnifying plastics? And even if the lens itself is glass (and there is glass and glass!), the mount is sure to be plastic.

Such magnifiers can be (and are) sold to people who know very little about the optical properties of a lens. Our customers know lenses and we would consider it an insult to offer them such lowgrade magnifiers.

Our Magnifiers are different and that means better. First of all, they are real Magnifying Glasses. That means that the optical part is made of real, honest Glass. Secondly, the lenses are mounted in

metal rims, not in brittle plastic! And thirdly, and most important of all, they are optically perfect. And that means free from distortion, free from spurious reflections, and free from objectionable discolorations of the image. The image is enlarged, but not altered.

We have a very good method of testing magnifiers. It may sound silly, but we take pictures with them. Since we are dealing with a single lens (a one-element lens), we do not expect to get the same results as with, say, an apochromatic Dagor-type. But we do expect to get pictures which are free from obvious flaws. If you want to test our Magnifying Lenses, do as we do: Take a piece of black paper and cut a hole of approximately one inch diameter. Fasten this paper to the magnifier by means of adhesive tape. The hole should be in the center of the lens (like a primitive diaphragm). Since our Magnifiers have an equivalent Focal Length of about 210mm, you now have a lens with an effective aperture of approximately F/8, give or take half-a-stop. Remove the elements from the lens you have on your 4x5 view camera and use the shutter to expose your film. We have a 120 back for ours but even a Polaroid back should be good enough for the test. Focus carefully on the groundglass and take a few exposures at different shutter speeds. We did just that with our Magnifying Leses and were amazed. Our "Private Eye" Magnifiers are really that good!

We have them in three sizes but except for the diameter, they are identical in their specifications. They are ideally suited for testing slides or negatives for sharpness and detail, for inspecting postage stamps or coins, for reading small print and for 1001 similar (or dissimilar) applications. The huge 5" Glass (which has acquired the nickname "The Sherlock Holmes") is the most useful, but, apart from the size, the other models will serve you equally well.

To put the whole thing in a nutshell: These are the Best Magnifying Glasses you can buy. Direct import and the elimination of middlemen, distributors, importers, or jobbers enables us to bring them to you at these low prices. Don't let the low prices cloud your judgment. We assure you that they are Top Quality Magnifiers. Sherlock Holmes would have been proud to own one!

Exposure Meter for Electronic Strobeflash

When you use Electronic Strobeflash you have to trust the "rating" the manufacturers put on their strobes. They give you a "Guide Number" and wish you Good Luck! Even if we assume that the guide numbers are correct (and more often than not they are anything but correct) there are so many variables that change the amount of light which reaches the subject that the Guide Number can be considered just that: a "guide" but never an accurate mathematical value to give you the actual correct F-Stop.

Things get even worse if you use more than one strobeflash. I would say that all the calculators in the world cannot figure out the correct exposure for multiple flash sources, no matter how many "systems" they devise for doing the figuring. The only way to know, really **know**, is to measure the light that reaches the subject.

Easier said than done. You may have a very good exposure meter but the duration of the flash (say, 1/1000 sec. or less) is far too short to make it possible for your exposure meter to see it, let alone to register it. Now you have two choices: Either you throw away your strobes and use photo floods, quartz lights or other permanent studio lights or, far cheaper and more satisfactory, you use the new Cambron EMES Exposure Meter for Electronic Strobeflash.

Without going into lengthy technical details (which would be of interest solely to electrical engineers) here's what the Cambron EMES does: It measures the actual total amount of light reaching the subject regardless whether the light comes directly from the strobe or whether it is bounced off the ceiling, the wall, the floor, or even a mirror! Regardless whether the light comes from a single strobe, two strobes, or a battery of strobes. Regardless how the light is mixed from

direct light and bouncelight. And you don't need a degree from M.I.T. to use the Cambron EMES: You move the sliding indicator to the ASA rating of your film and place the EMES near the subject (an easel is built in) and fire the strobe setup once. The Cambron EMES responds by giving you, electronically, the exact F/Stop at which you set your lens. (You know, of course, that the shutter speed has no influence on the exposure derived from strobeflashes).

To make it even more convenient to obtain the correct exposure reading without walking back to the camera to fire the strobe, you can do the lightmetering and firing from the position of the subject. A Remote Triggering Assembly Device is available as an optional accessory. One end of this unit plugs into the EMES meter. The other end plugs into your strobe with a PC fitting. When you slide the switch on the EMES meter to "ON", the strobe fires and the EMES meter displays the locked-in reading for the correct F-Stop. The connecting cord is more than four yards long and you may be concerned about a time lag in firing. Don't worry: the Remote Triggering Device takes care of this. It has a built-in booster which permits carrying the electric load at a low voltage and boosting it back to full load to assure accurate measurement of the total light.



WHAT

is a Semi Fish Eye?

No, it's not the eye of a semi-fish. It's an optical front converter which makes an ultra wide angle lens out of your normal 50mm lens. It converts your lens into a 21mm Extreme Wide Angle Lens. 

It elongated the car by a factor of three or more and the result is a striking picture of a "dream" car. In fact the whole picture looks like a dream (or nightmare, if you are not a car bug!)

I can't go into all the details but I want to show you that the Cambron Semi Fish Eye is much more than a wide angle lens. It is a creative tool whose possibilities are virtually limitless. 



How does the MonoZoom compare with a regular 1000mm focal-length lens? The Mono Zoom is remarkably good for the price and convenience but the 1000mm lens (which probably costs ten times as much) is very definitely superior. Ten times as superior? Well.....

An Updated Version of an Interesting Column.

An Updated Version of an Interesting Column.

Most of our friends and customers will remember the column "Thinking Out Loud" which appeared "at random intervals" in The Exakta News and E.E.I.S. from around 1950 to 1979. These columns were written by our founder, known to everybody as Mr. Exakta, Earl Seymour.

As food for thought we are updating a column which appeared in the August, 1978 issue of E.E.I.S. At the time it was written, Gold Bullion had just reached the \$200.00 mark. Today (that is as we are updating the old column) Gold hovers around \$400.00 an ounce.

Apart from adjusted figures, the column is reprinted exactly as it appeared in 1978. You will find it twice as true today as it was then!

Thinking out loud... A Column, appearing at random intervals.

The other day we moved some old papers from one storage room to another. There was a Price List of Exakta Equipment from the Year 1958, and several copies of "Seymour's Exakta News" of the same year. The List Price of the Exakta was shown in the Official Factory List at \$399.50. This included the semi-automatic F/2 Biotar. We advertised the camera in The Exakta News for \$269.50 plus \$9.95 for the case.

I did a little "research" and found that in 1958 an ounce of gold sold for thirty dollars. To buy an Exakta from Seymour's you had to plunk down the equivalent of slightly less than ten ounces of gold.

It didn't take much researching to find that today (that is at the time we are updating this column) an ounce of Gold sells for about \$400.00. It took even less research to find that we (Seymour's) are selling the new EDX-3 with F1.7 Lens for \$259.50 + 16.95 for the Case. Even if you add a few filters, a gadget bag, and some minor accessories, it takes you less than the equivalent of 2/3 (two-thirds) of an ounce of Gold to obtain the Exakta EDX-3. Now, if you start comparing, this situation becomes even more amazing. In 1958, your ten ounces of gold bought a camera without any kind of lightmetering, a semi-automatic (i.e. cocking type) lens with a speed of only F/2. Today, your two-thirds of an ounce buys a modern camera with highly sophisticated electronic lightmeter System, a fully automatic superior lens with a speed of F1.7, coupled to the Wide-Open Metering System!

I looked at my figures from all angles. How could it be possible that today, when everything costs so much, a vastly superior camera of much greater actual value costs, in actual purchasing power, only a fraction of the price of a much simpler, primitive camera 25 years ago? Was there a mathematical error in my figures? I kept figuring, first one way, then another, and then a third way and always came up with the same results:

The better, greatly improved and more valuable camera costs today:

- 1) only one-fifteenth
- b) only 7.5 per cent
- c) 92.5 per cent less

than the old model 25 years ago. Makes you wonder...



Could You Do With A Little Extra Sparkle In Your Enlargements?

Have you looked at your enlargements lately? Are they as good as the beautiful prints you see at exhibitions? Do they qualify for Blue Ribbons or at least for an "Honorable Mention"?

Nearly everybody knows that you need a very good lens to take very good pictures. But when it comes to enlarging lenses these same people (who are very finnicky when it comes to selecting a new lens for their camera) buy the cheapest Enlarging Lens they can lay their hands on, because "an enlarging lens is an enlarging lens." Nothing could be further from the truth. While many top professionals are convinved that the quality of the enlarging lens is more important than the quality of the taking lens, we don't go quite that far. But we do say that the quality of the enlarging lens is at least as important as the quality of the taking lens. No matter how good the original shot, the enlargement will be only as good as the enlarging lens (or as bad!)

You don't want a lecture on the optical theory behind enlarging lenses. You don't want to read a lot of fancy words or mathematical formulas. We'll just tell it to you in plain English: Making an enlargement is the same as taking a photograph but the ratios are inverted: the ORIGINAL is small and the IMAGE is large. It would be an oversimplification to say that an enlarging lens should be "reversed in

the mount" but a good enlarging must be designed as an enlarging lens from the ground up. And a good enlarging lens must be a good lens or it will not render good enlargements, no matter how good the negative.

One of the indications of the quality of an enlarging lens is the number of elements. True, you can make an enlarging lens with three elements. It will be as good as a three-element lens but no better. Many enlarging lenses are designed around four elements, an adequate number of elements. The result: an "adequate" lens, good enough for the average amateur. But for a superb enlarging lens you need more elements to counteract the optical faults which are inherent in all photographic lenses. That brings us back to the El Cambron XQ Enlarging Lens.

The El Cambron XQ (X-hibition Quality) Enlarging Lens has six elements. All known optical faults have been corrected. A special antireflection coating eliminates the last vestiges of internal reflection. In an enlarging lens this is of even greater importance than in a taking lens because we are dealing with large quantities of strong light from the enlarging light. Six elements make it possible to kill the curvature of the image: a flat field renders an undistorted enlargement and, what is even more important, assures sharpness all the way to the very corners.





some spacing rings ("shims") out of paper or



EXAKTA REPAIRS

When did you last have your Exakta cleaned and relubricated? You can get a great deal of additional mileage out of your Exakta if you take care of it. A new Exakta will usually not require re-lubrication for about two years. Older cameras should be "washed" and relubricated every two years. The old lubricant usually cakes up (combining with th dust that seeps in) and after a while the lubricant becomes an abrasive. If you let it go too long, your gears will be in sad shape. It's cheaper to give your Exakta regular service.
