### INTRODUCTION

Exakta Equipment Information Service ("EEIS" for short) is a new Seymour Publication, quite different from Seymour's Exakta News. EEIS is written for a relatively small group of Exakta Fans. It is available by subscription only. Details how to subscribe and how to get your subscription free are explained in this issue.

### How does EEIS differ from the Exakta News?

Seymour's Exakta News is a publication written for a large number of people. Our Distribution List contains about One Hundred Thousand Names, give or take a few thousand. It takes a long time to get out such a large magazine. Copy must be written, photographs taken, layouts made; type must be set, a large run must be printed and bound, addressed, mailed. All this takes a long time. It may amaze you that, on the average, three months elapse from the day we start preparing a new issue of the Exakta News to the day the mailman hands it to you. Three months is a long time! It makes such a large publication rather inflexible and we had to find a way to supplement it with a better way of getting "Instant Information" to a small interested group of Exakta Fans. EEIS was the answer.

### "Instant Information"

Many new items miss the deadline for each issue of the Exakta News. They will appear in EEIS almost as soon as they are available. There can be no last-minute changes in the Exakta News but updated information will appear immediately in EEIS. Late developments will be announced in EEIS. In fact, anything which depends on fast customer notification will appear in EEIS. Think of EEIS as Instant Supplement to the Exakta News.

### **New Items**

New Exakta Accessories, new Models, new Lenses, etc. are being developed all the time. Information about such new items usually does not reach the consumer for months. If a new item misses an issue of the Exakta News (even by a day or two), you will not hear about this item till you get the next issue. As a reader of EEIS you can count on "Instant Information" about new new items. You will actually be using new items before the general public will know that they exist!

### Advance Information ON Sales

As a Seymour Customer you know that we always run Sales on selected items. These Sales are announced in the Exakta News. As a reader of EEIS you may have as much as four weeks advance information on such Sales. You will have first choice on these money-saving offers, long before they have been pickedover or even sold out!

### **EEIS Readers get First Choice**

No matter what it is, you can't buy it unless you know about it. EEIS readers WILL know about it. You can't take advantage of a sale if you are not told about it. EEIS readers WILL be told. As an EEIS reader you are never, never under any obligation to buy anything; but if you want to buy it, you get first choice.

### **Small Circulation**

The Exakta News goes to such a large number of people that we can show only those items of which we have a large quantity. Imagine what would happen if we received a thousand orders for an item of which we have, say, fifty pieces!

EEIS, on the other hand, will contain information on small special purchases, limited-supply items, close-outs of small remaining stocks, details about equipment which we consider to be of interest to a limited number of people, and, from time to time, a list of scarce used items which, until now, could only be sold in our showroom.

### Close-Outs

There can be several reasons for marking down or closing out an item: The last few pieces of an item which cannot be reordered from the factory; the remainder of a discontinued item; a superseded model. Close-Outs are sold as long as they last, on a first-come, first-served basis. EEIS readers receive immediate information on all close-outs which are offered at great savings.

### Save up to 50% on "Specials"

A "Special" may be a special puchase from a distributor who needed cash. It may be a specially selected item, marked down for any number of reasons. Whatever the reason, "Specials" will appear immediately in EEIS.

"Limited Supply" Items

If we have only a small supply of an item, we cannot advertise it to the general public. We might receive ten times as many orders as we can fill. But an announcement in EEIS will be safe: EEIS goes only to a small list.

**Used Equipment** 

Customers who have been on the Distribution List of the Exakta News for more than fifteen years will remember that we sometimes published lists of used Exakta Equipment. As the circulation of the Exakta News grew, we had to discontinue these lists because we usually received more orders for the listed items than we could fill. EEIS makes it possible once more to publish lists of good used equipment, since EEIS goes only to a small list of subscribers.

**EEIS Specials** 

There will be EEIS Specials, i.e., price reductions on selected items which will change from issue to issue. They will be available to EEIS Readers ONLY.

### **Future Projects**

EEIS is flexible enough to try all kinds of experiments. We have in mind running a "Classified" Section where readers can advertise equipment they want to sell, swap, or buy. Let us know what you think of this idea.

We were also thinking of publishing articles of interest to Exakta Users, such as what filters to use and how to use them, or "request" articles, if we do get requests from our readers. This means from YOU.

In any case, we would like to hear from you. Any suggestions? We're flexible.

Therefore, neither your distance glasses nor your reading glasses can solve your viewing and focusing problem. Try as you will, the image remains blurred or, at best, hard to see clearly.

We make the lenses to fit the Exakta Eyepiece (but we can make them to fit any kind of eyepiece). Remember that we do NOT make lenses for eyeglasses. All "Eagle Eye" Lenses are corrected specifically as a focusing aid for your camera, corrected to your very own personal requirements.

# EEIS Readers Receive Advance Information About the New Ihagee "West Exakta"

Rumors have been flying about Ihagee's new "West" Exakta, but facts were hard to come by. Well, here is the first authentic description of this new camera.

To answer your first question before you ask it: Yes, Seymour's has the camera in stock and can ship it the day your order is received.

The official Model Name is: Exakta Twin TL. The "TL", obviously, stands for "Through-the-Lens" Focusing and Light Metering. Buy why "Twin"? Because it was originally designed as a twin system, taking its own lenses (more about the lens mount later) as well as "Classic" Exakta Lenses. Some time between the name giving and the final production the mount was improved to take, in addition to the classic lenses, Exakta RTL Lenses, and, of all things, Pentax and Praktica Lenses. Inexpensive Adapters are offered and the system makes the new Exakta the most versatile universal lens mount camera in the world. Since it would have been a little awkward to change the name to "Quadruple TL", they left it at Twin-TL.

The basic Twin TL Mount is a miracle of engineering. It has the widest unobstructed opening of any 35mm camera. This means that you can use lenses which would vignette (cut off) in any other camera. It also means that the lens adapters (for Pentax Lenses, etc.) fit INSIDE the lens mount, permitting a full focusing range of all lenses, including "adapted" ones!

What else makes the Exakta Twin-TL unusual? Well, there are the lenses, for one thing. The Twin-TL is the first Exakta with an F1.4 lens. (To anticipate your question: No, the lens cannot be used in the classic Exakta or the Exakta RTL-1000). The F1.4 lens costs a little more (and is worth it!) but if you want to keep the cost down, you can buy the Exakta Twin-TL with the F1.8 lens. Again anticipating your question: Yes, you can buy the Twin-TL Body without lens.

The next feature is the newly developed light metering system. It has two CdS Sensors to avoid "guessy" readings. The two sensors feed into an intricate computer "brain" and give you a reading which you can trust implicitly. Like all Exaktas, the meter uses the "true" reading method without mechanical linkage and "approximations". What you see is what you get, or should we say: "What the film sees is what the meter gets".



A push-button switch puts the meter into the circuit and. at the same time, causes your lens to respond to the light meter. You can switch it at will, but there is a great design idea: A split second after you trip the shutter, the meter automatically shuts off (making your battery last three times as long as in other cameras) and puts the lens back into the fully automatic mode. You can take subsequent shots at the previous meter reading which remains "locked" into the lens: your lens will close down to the same F/Stop as before if the light has not changed. If the light has changed or if you want to take a new reading, just push the switch down and the automatic process will simply repeat itself. Of course, the meter and the shutter are coupled to each other. Change the shutter speed and the meter will automatically compensate. Unlike mechanical metering systems, the Exakta will compensate for ALL variables when it computes the exposure: Filters, Close-Up Focusing, Extensions, Bellows, and so on.

What else? Plenty! An all-metal reciprocating shutter of uncanny accuracy. Shutter speeds to 1/1000 sec. Delayed Action ("Self Timer"). Left and right hand Shutter Release. Automatic Zero Reset. Eyelevel PentaPrism with Combination Fresnel Viewing Screen with MicroGrid Rangefinder (built-in, non-removable). Built-in Accessory Shoe (Hot and Cold). Professional Black Finish.

Did I leave anything out? Ah yes: it handles beautifully and it takes terrific pictures. I know: I handled it and the camera took terrific pictures!

You have seen close-up devices that focus down to one inch. And you have seen lenses that focus to Infinity. But you have never seen a Bellows-and-Lens Combination which will do both! The secret lies in the specially constructed lens mount which deeply recesses the optical components of the lens, permitting the rear ele-ment to be positioned exactly where the rear element of a standard lens would be if it were attached to the camera itself. Now you know WHY this combination has such a complete focusing range. But HOW it is done, is still a miracle of design engineering.

### THE BELLOWS:

The Proxette is the original Exakta Bellows, designed, engineered, and built in the Dresden Exakta Plant. In the true German Exakta Tradition, the Proxette Bellows is built to do its job well and to last vir-

tually forever.

The Proxette has genuine Leather Bellows, All Metal Construction, Twin Rod Suspension, Positive Lock, Smooth Operation. It has a Dual Hookup System, permitting vertical and horizontal use. It has two tripod suspension sockets. permits you to vary the position of the lens relative to the subject. Or, if you wish, you may keep the Lens-to-Subject Distance fixed (for constant image ratio) bringing the film plane into focus by moving the rear part of the Proxette. You are in total command!

The construction of the Proxette keeps the lens permanently aligned, both laterally and relative to the lens axis. This means that the lens axis will always be exactly perpendicular to the film plane and that the lens axis will touch the film plane exactly at the intersection of the diagonals. This is extremely important for Close-Up Work where the slightest deviation would result in photographs which are sharp in one corner and blurred in the other three corners. Permanent alignment is achieved by the use of two chrome plated

Once focused, the Proxette provides a positive lock which does not slide into the next "notch" because there are no notches! It prevents the lens from gradually dropping into a lower position when the unit is pointed downward. Once focused, the Proxette STAYS focused.

THE LENS:

The 50mm F2.8 Macro Extenar is a superbly corrected lens of modified (i.e. improved) Tessar Type Formula. It pro-duces ultra sharp images, regardless whether it is focused on Infinity, at moderate closeup, or at extreme macro setting. It bayonets into the Proxette. The diaphragm control ring is conveniently located outside the bellows, while the optical part of the lens is located deep inside the bellows. The front eiement is so far recessed that the lens barrel acts as a deep lens shade, keeping stray light from hitting the lens itself. The result is an uncannily clear picture because only image-producing light rays enter the lens. The usual ambient light is prevented from entering and bouncing around inside the lens which would lead to a haze across the image on the film. Pictures taken with the Macro Extenar are not only beautifully sharp, they are also unusually crisp: just what you need for macro

While the Proxette can be used with any lens, the Extenar gives it an unusual focusing range from Infinity to Extreme Close-Up: from a Mile to an Inch! No matter what distance you want to cover, the Macro Extenar in the Proxette will give it to you.

# My Camera has a Built-in Meter. I don't need a Hand Held Meter. Or do I?

You certainly do! Built-in meters are terrific but they have their limitations. If you take pictures only in good light, on conventional film, without filters (or only with ordinary filters), if you don't take imaginative pictures, if you never take extreme close-ups or copy pictures from books, in short, if you stay within the snapshot region....you don't need a handheld meter.

But if you ever want to take a picture which is beyond the scope of your built-in meter, you certainly do need a handheld meter. Not just any handheld meter, of course. Some handheld meters don't have a greater range than your built-in meter and if you look at the specifications, you will see that some of the most widely advertised (and high-priced) meters have an amazingly narrow range. True, some go rather high but are deficient in the low end (where the extended range costs money). Others may give fairreadings for the conventional films but not for very slow or very fast films. Still others severely limit the exposure time to hide their limited range.

Finally, before you decide on any Exposure Meter, look at another very important feature; Accuracy. What good is an Exposure Meter if you can't trust it for correct exposure? How do you know? Point the meter and watch the needle. If it bounces back and forth, you know that the meter "can't make up its mind." Make sure the needle goes to the correct reading and

# **Automatic Computer\* Strobes**

## \*Authorized and Protected Under Honeywell Patents

You may have been wondering why we steadfastly refused to offer Computer Strobes until now. Why did Seymour's deliberately pass up many thousand dollars' worth of business? The answer is very simple: We tested many units but could not, with a clear conscience, recommend a single one. Some simply could not perform. Others had a light output far below their optimistically advertised ratings. And at least one manufacturer refused service on units

sent in by the owners. Still other units seemed to infringe on patents. While we have no way of knowing what patents are valid and what part of the circuit may be used freely, we certainly did not intend to get involved with somebody else's patent disputes.

All problems have been solved in the new Acme-Lite Automatic Computer Strobes. They perform exactly as advertised. Their actual light output is exactly the same as their rated "Guide Numbers". They are covered by the guarantee of the largest manufacturer of professional lighting equipment. And they are manufactured under license of the patent owner (and every unit says so!)

As you would expect from Seymour's, we selected not only the brand which we considered best, but also the two units which we considered the best of that line. They are the Acme-Lite Computer Strobe Model 320CA, and the Acme-Lite Computer Strobe Model 350CR.

### How do the Acme-Lite Automatic Computer Strobes work?


Once you have mounted your Automatic Computer Strobe on your camera, and have set it to "Automatic" you can completely ignore it. When you point your camera and push the shutter button, the strobe unit flashes, measures its own light, feeds the light intensity into its built-in Computer Circuit and automatically cuts off the light after enough light has reached the subject to obtain the correct exposure. All this happens so incredibly fast that the computer can cut the duration of the light

anywhere between 1/800 sec. and 1/50,000 sec. No. that's not a misprint. It can actually cut the flash duration to an incredibly short 1/50,000 sec., if this "time" is required to give the correct exposure. If more "time" is required, the flash duration can be extended all the way to a very "long" 1/800 sec. Normally, the duration is somewhere in between these two extremes. The whole circuitry is a miracle of modern miniaturized computer design.


Incredible as it all sounds, it really works, and I can vouch for it: Next time you drop in, I will show you pictures of our pet cats which I took at distances ranging from about 2 feet (with my normal lens) to more than 15 feet (with a 135mm tele lens). I never gave the strobe a thought and concentrated on the cats. Every shot was right on the nose and as far as exposure is concerned, you could not tell a close-in shot from "long shot.





# What's this Talk about Exaktas with Screw Thread Mount?
